
Dear T.J.C.S.G.A. Members:

Mr. Anthony is involved in several professional activities that are educationally and community oriented. This well-known lecturer been the recipient of several prestigious honors over the years.

## ENTERTAINMENT

If you wish to nominate your chapter, please write a short narrative telling why your chapter is deserving (only one nomination per region).

Mail nominations and verifiable references of the activities stated by the student or chapter nominee to your regional president school. Be sure the nominations are signed by a Student Government sponsor. The region will select the Student of the Year and the Chapter of the Year and in turn submit these nominees to the T.J.C.S.G.A. Executive Board for selection. Student of the Year nominees will be interviewed by a committee at the convention and awarded a plaque at the Saturday night General Assembly. (Be sure the nominee will be attending the convention.)

## MEDIA

1. Must be a slide presentation, film presentation or combination of both. (10 points)
2. Entries must be between 5-10 minutes in length. (10 points)
3. The theme "On The Trail To Success" must be used. (15 points)
4. Quality of presentation (65 points)

## SCRAPBOOK

The award will be based on the following:

1. Content (50 points)
2. Cover (20 points)
3. Theme — "On The Trail To Success" (20 points) (Entry must follow this form)
4. Neatness (10 points)
5. Size must be no no larger than 24" x 30"
6. Scrapbook can have an unlimited number of pages.

## ESSAY

The essay will be judged on the following:

4. Essay must include the theme "On The Trail To Success" (20 points)
5. Continuity throughout the essay. (20 points)

## SONG

1. Submit a tape by the deadline of 5:00 p.m., Friday, March 4, 1994.
2. The song should be no longer than 3 minutes in length and pertain to the theme "On The Trail To Success."
3. Submit lyrics sheet with tape.

## CAMPAIGN GUIDELINES

1. No campaign materials may be included in convention packets.
2. Provide support letter from school administration if you wish to run for office. All letters must be submitted to the registration desk by 10:00 a.m. Saturday, March 5.
3. No alcohol may be used for campaigning.
4. All candidates for the Executive Board will draw for a campaign table during the nominations committee meeting.
5. All candidates must attend the nominations committee meeting.
6. Campaign posters may be no larger than standard poster board size.
7. Only masking tape may be used for hanging posters on the walls.
8. No confetti may be used.
9. No campaign material will be allowed to be posted outside of the convention area.
10. Any violation of these guidelines will be submitted to the Ethics Committee for adjudication.

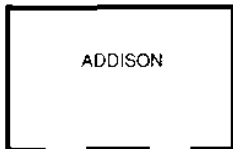
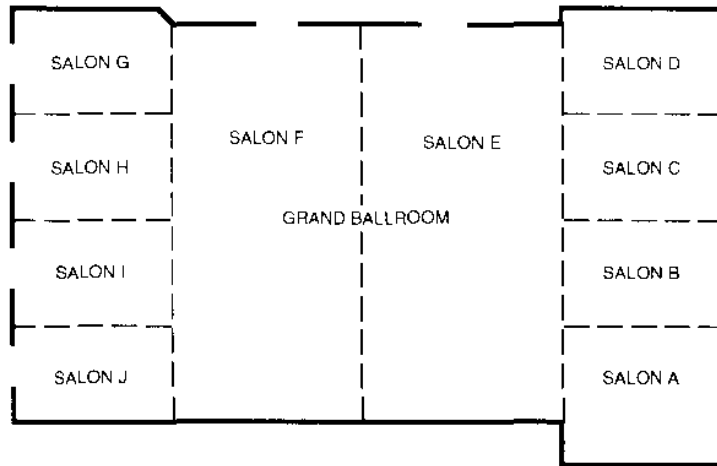
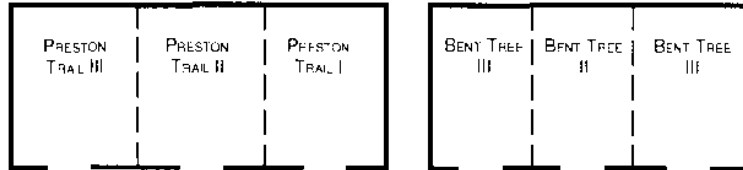
