General Assembly II
April 7, 2000
6:30 P.M.

President Tonya Player of Tyler Junior College called the meeting to order at 8:15 P.M.

- I. Secretary Aimee Sample of Midland College took Roll Call. There were 47 schools present and 3 schools absent. Those absent were:
 - Cedar Valley College
 - Galveston College
 - HCCS Central
- II. Liberty Schauf of Kingwood College read the Orders of the Day. Jay Vaden of Midland College corrected the spelling of treasurer. The Orders of the Day then stood corrected.
- III. Reading of the Previous Minutes- Patrice McKinney of Richland College made a motion to suspend with the reading of the previous minutes. Kenneth Ford of Wharton County Main Campos seconded the motion. There was no discussion on the motion and it was put to a vote and approved.
- IV. Officer Reports:
 - a. President Tonya Player, Tyler Junior College, said that the weather will be getting bad tonight, there is a cold front coming in. She then went back to previous minutes. VI. New Business:

President Tonya Player of Tyler Junior College asked for any new business from the floor. Charlotte Leon Bell of Texarkana College brought forth the Amendments proposed for the Constitution. She moved to adopt the amendment I submitted by Amarillo College.

Amend Article IX of the TJCSGA Constitution by adding Section 6 to read:

Section 6. Any action of the general assembly requiring payment must be in the form of a resolution. The resolutions must consider and submit a written report to all members before any action can be taken. The written report must include an outline of the factual background information relevant to the resolution as well as arguments for and against. There was no discussion on the motion and it was put to a vote and carried. This Amendment will be added to the constitution.

She then moved to adopt the amendment 2 submitted by Amarillo College.

Amend Article IV, Section 2, Sub-Section C of the TJCSGA Constitution By adding Section 7 to read:

Section 7 to provide written direction at the voting podium during officer Elections. The parliamentarian will stand near the podium at all times of the vote to verbally explain the voting procedure. In the event that the parliamentarian school is running for a state office, the president shall appoint a qualified person to adhere to these procedures. There should be a generic example at the podium showing the number of votes available per office. There was no discussion on the motion and it was put to a vote and earned. This Amendment will be added to the constitution.

There was no more new business from the floor.

VII. Announcements:

Tracy Johnson of Del Mar College announced that the Region 6 Scholarship committee has a meeting in room 2015 right after this meeting.

Charlotte Leon-Bell of Texarkana College announced that she needs to meet with constitution and bylaws committee after the meeting in room 626.

President Tonya Player asked the assembly to please leave roster information on the table.
