- VI. Officers' Reports:
 - a. President: Cal Pifer (Kingwood College) welcomed everyone to the meeting.  - d. Treasurer: Amanda Zachary (Tyler) let April Sessler (Amarillo College) go over the budget report and gave some suggestions for 2004-2005's budget.

 - c. Convention entertainment budget: Navarro College: Finding sponsors for the convention will be taken to a committee. Speakers that were suggested were: Perry, Dewhurst, Strayhourn, Liz Carpenter, and the first injured soldier in Iran.
 - d. New award: “Most Professional School”: This new award will be gauged on how students professionally present their school at state convention.
