- I. Call to order: Cal Pifer (Kingwood) called the meeting to order at 3:25 P.M.
- II. Orders of the day: Joe Buvid (Blinn-Bryan) read the orders of the day. Items added were Section VIII. Subsection E. Workshops/breakouts; Section IX subsection L. Student Activity Fee Guideline, M. Nomination Committee/Screening, N. Contingency fund, and O. T-shirts.
- III. United States Pledge
- IV. Texas Pledge
- V. Moment of Silence
- VI. Minutes: Chrystal Williams (Navarro) motioned to approve the minutes as written. Joe Buvid (Blinn-Bryan) seconded the motion. The motion passed.
- VII. Officers' Reports
 - a. President: Cal Pifer (Kingwood) explained that we would approve the items from the last meeting. We would also wait until Brandon Franke is present to go over section IX. New Business, subsection b. Boundary and redistricting discussion.
 - b. Vice President: Chrystal Williams (Navarro) will receive any suggestions for entertainment.
 - c. Secretary: There was no report.
 - d. Treasurer: Amanda Zachry (Tyler) asked that we approve a contingency fund for emergencies. The money will be placed in a savings account to gain interest.
 - e. Bulletin: There was no report.
 - f. Host: Bree Williams (Frank Phillips College) reported that awards for the state convention will be received from Midwest trophies in the shape of Texas. At \$40.66 each the total would be \$1100.
 - g. Parliamentarian: There was no report.
 - h. Advisor: There was no report.
 - i. Advisor Elect: There was no report.
- VIII. Unfinished Business
 - a. Approve convention registration increase: Joe moved to raise convention fees to \$105 for students, \$110 for advisors, \$120 for late students, and \$130 for late advisors. Chrystal seconded the motion. The motion passed.
 - b. Approve host presentation: Joe moved to approve Frank Phillip's presentation for the 2005 state convention excluding the schedule. Amanda Zachary seconded, motion passed.
 - c. Approve state theme: Amanda Zachary moved to approve the state theme as "Power of One in Austin". Joe seconded. Amanda withdrew her motion and moved to approve the state theme as "The Power of One in Austin" Joe seconded. The motion passed.

- d. Ratify existing dress code: Amber moved to keep the current dress code for state convention the same and specified no flip-flops and ties are not required. Teresa seconded. Chrystal moved to amend the motion and change the dress code to represent each individual's school in the most professional manner. Amber seconded. Amendment carried. The original motion passed.
 - i. Joe moved to create the "Most Professional School Award", which would be awarded to the college who represents their school in the most professional manner. Joe withdrew his motion and moved to create the "Most Professional School Award" which also would incorporate the spirit award and based upon the new dress code, interactions and participations. The state advisor, the state advisor elect, and the president of the advisors will select the recipient of the new award. The winning school will also receive a plaque. Chrystal seconded. The motion passed.
- e. Workshops/breakouts: Chrystal took suggestions and ideas for workshops for the state convention.

Amber Landry moved to a recess, Amanda Zachary seconded.

Cal Pifer recommenced at 4:45 P.M.

IX. New Business-Cal limited the discussion of each item to 20 minutes.

- a. Campaigning Rules-Amanda moved to approve the guidelines excluding no. 8 and change no. 14 to read, "No hard items can be thrown". Teresa seconded. The motion fails after further discussion. Joe moved to suspend the article so a new draft of the campaign rules could be prepared for the evening meeting, Amber Landry seconded. Joe withdrew his motion then moved to send the revision of the campaign rules to committee that would be presented later. Amanda Zachary seconded the motion.
- b. Boundary and redistricting discussion: Tabled until Brandon Franke's return.
- c. Committee structure and purpose: Cal summarized committee structure and purpose.
- d. Legislative research committee: Cal assigned the Legislative committee and duties to James Nunn, Region 2 President and replaced with the General Board. Cal would reinstate Legislative committee.
- e. Publicity: Cal urged that we increase TJCSGA's visibility in the state. Have a special committee that would find TJCSGA's effectiveness and find more opportunities for us to become more visible. They would put a poll on the website or in the bulletin.
- f. Sponsorship committee: Joe Buvid (Blinn-Bryan) will chair the Sponsorship committee. The committee will find Texas based businesses that might be willing to help with convention costs.
- g. General board: The general board has done a great job this past year. Instead of having to wait until state to vote on issues, maybe there could be an electronic system put in to place.
- h. STARR teleconferencing: STARR teleconferencing should be in all of the community colleges. There will be an executive board meeting in September using the STARR teleconferencing system.
- i. TACC/TCCTA/TJCSGA partnership: Texas Association of Community Colleges and Texas Community Colleges Teachers Association are community college organizations involved with the legislation. TJCSGA will collaborate with the TACC and TCCTA to use part of their legislation and use part of their legislative agenda. We will meet on Monday, June 28, 2004 and discuss how the three organizations can work together
- j. Key schools with key leadership: Individual Student Governments should be urged to meet with their area legislatures.
- k. Strategic letter writing campaign: We should have a strategic letter writing campaign through the students and through the presidents of each college to have Texas Legislature to lower tuition.
- l. Student activity fee guidelines: If schools have a student activity fee attached to classes, students must be on the funding committee. If those schools have an active Student Government, then SGA students must be on this committee.
- m. Nomination committee/screening: The board discussed how page 57 of the Uniformity handbook violates the Constitution on page 16. No action was taken.

- n. Contingency fund: Amanda Zachary moved to start a contingency fund with the \$1000 from the Silent Auction in a Bank of America savings account. Chrystal Williams seconded. Motion passes.
- o. T-shirts: The state logo design from the bulletin will be the logo on the shirts. We will receive quotes on T-shirts at a later date with the restriction the shirt costs will be between limited to \$12.50 to 17.50. Amarillo College offered to make the officer name tags at 40 cents each.

Cal Pifer moved to a recess. Chrystal Williams seconded.

The meeting recommenced at 11:35 P.M.

- IX. b. Boundary and redistricting issue was removed from table: Amber Landry moved to accept the new division of districts proposed by Brandon Franke. Joe Buvid seconded. Motion passed. See attached list of new districts.
- X. Announcements: There were no announcements.
- XI. Adjournments: Chrystal Williams moved to adjourn the meeting. Joe Buvid seconds. The meeting was adjourned at 12:25 P.M.
